PROHIBITION OF ENTRY INTO SAFETY ZONE.

I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, the Designated Authority in respect of the area specified as being adjacent to the State of Victoria, hereby prohibit from entering into or remaining in, except with my consent in writing, the area of the safety zone described hereunder, all vessels other than vessels engaged in or in connexion with petroleum exploration operations or operations for the recovery of petroleum authorized by me in the area concerned.

DESCRIPTION OF AREA OF SAFETY ZONE.

The area which extends to a distance of five hundred metres measured from each point of the structure known as the Barracouta platform situated at or about the point of latitude 38 deg. 17 min. 53 sec. south, longitude 147 deg. 40 min. 29 sec. east.

REVOCATION.

The instrument, dated 16th October, 1968, notice of which appeared in the Victoria Gazette, No. 88, dated the 23rd October, 1968, which prohibited the entry of certain vessels into the safety zone surrounding the Barracouta platform, is hereby revoked.
